STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES

Scouts recorded more than **15.6 MILLION** hours of service to their communities, at a value of more than **\$376 MILLION**.

Eagle Scout projects, which are planned and led by Scouts, accounted for more than \$196 MILLION in service to the nation alone — averaging 152 HOURS of service apiece.



BUILD ADVENTURE

Just over **1 MILLION** Scouts attended our day and summer camps, as well as our high-adventure camps in New Mexico, Minnesota, Florida, and West Virginia, adding up to **5.6 MILLION** nights in 2017.



BUILD LEADERS

In 2017, a total of **55,494** young men earned the rank of Eagle Scout, joining the more than **2.5 MILLION** who have earned Scouting's highest honor since the first recipient in 1912.



Starting in **2018**, girls, too, will be able to begin their journey as Cub Scouts. A program for older girls, launching in **2019**, will enable them to advance to the Eagle Scout rank.

GROW INTERESTS

The Exploring program's Career Interest Survey given to 150,000 6th–12th grade students showed that nearly half — 45 PERCENT — list STEM-related fields such as medicine and engineering at the top of their lists. This makes our co-ed STEM SCOUTS pilot program — which offers hands-on STEM exploration for students in grades 3-12 — more timely than ever.
